### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia Ora Awahou Community,

Creative thinking. Critical thinking. Divergent thinking. Lateral thinking. At school lately (as staff and with the students), we have been taking a look at all of the different ways we can think to problem solve and approach various situations, rather than all thinking the same or waiting to be told what to do. Dr Seuss summed it up perfectly – "Think left and think right, think low and think high. Oh, the things you can think up if only you try!" We are starting to see some shifts in these skills with our students, through such initiatives as Chapter Chat and PRIDE Challenges in Maharahara, and STEAM activities and Discovery Learning in Wharite. As staff, we are having a good look at the way we structure our days and timetables, the principles of Play-Based and STEM-based learning, how and what we assess, and what our true beliefs are around how we learn at Awahou School. This is very exciting (and mentally draining!) work as we build towards creating our new Awahou School localised curriculum, "From the River to the C's". There'll be more to come on this soon, including a parent information evening on this and the New Zealand Curriculum in the last week of term – so pencil this in to your calendars for Thursday, April 12th now. Education is in a very interesting space at present, with the recent announcement of a review of the entire system, and the upcoming collective contract negotiations with the government, and what these may bring. I hope for a quick, amicable agreement so that we can continue to provide the great education we do for our kids, with better conditions for students, teachers and Principals to be able to do this. We have managed to get through next week's first round of Paid Union Meetings without disruption to our classroom programme, however this may not necessarily be the case later on. ### **Teacher Only Day**

### Swimming Pool / Keys

Unfortunately, the consistently super warm weather seems to have left us now.

### **Booster Seats**

Did you know the legal requirement for booster seats is that any child up to 148cm and under 12 years old is required to be in a booster seat? It concerned us on our field trip yesterday that some of our kids didn't have these, and upon chatting with them, didn't have them regularly in their everyday cars either. It is also a liability for the parents who volunteer to provide transport on our trips, as if they are pulled over and children are not in a booster seat that should be, they are individually liable for any fines. This would mean we would need to pay for school buses on all of our trips, which would raise the cost significantly. Not to mention, the safety of our children is the number one reason for this law and is always our main priority! Please ensure your child has a booster seat if needed every time they travel!
